

For in it is revealed the righteousness of God from faith to faith; as it is written, "The one who is righteous by faith will live."





ABOUT ST. THOMAS MORE

Excerpts from Pope St. John Paul II's Apostolic Letter Issued Motu Proprio Proclaiming St. Thomas More Patron of Statesmen and Politicians; October 31, 2000.

Thomas More had a remarkable political career in his native land. Born in London in 1478 of a respectable family, as a young boy he was placed in the service of the Archbishop of Canterbury, John Morton, Lord Chancellor of the Realm. He then studied law at Oxford and London.

Throughout his life he was an affectionate and faithful husband and father, deeply involved in his children's religious, moral and intellectual education. His house offered a welcome to his children's spouses and his grandchildren, and was always open to his many young friends in search of the truth or of their own calling in life.

Highly esteemed by everyone for his unfailing moral integrity, sharpness of mind, his open and humorous character, and his extraordinary learning, in 1529 at a time of political and economic crisis in the country he was appointed by the King to the post of Lord Chancellor. The first layman to occupy this position, Thomas faced an extremely difficult period, as he sought to serve King and country. In fidelity to his principles, he concentrated on promoting justice and restraining the harmful influence of those who advanced their own interests at the expense of the weak. In 1532, not wishing to support Henry VIII's intention to take control of the Church in England, he resigned. He withdrew from public life, resigning himself to suffering poverty with his family and being deserted by many people who, in the moment of trial, proved to be false friends. Given his inflexible firmness in rejecting any compromise with his own conscience, in 1534 the King had him imprisoned in the Tower of London. At his trial, he made an impassioned defense of the freedom of the Church in her relations with the State. Condemned by the Court, he was beheaded.

The harmony between the natural and the supernatural is perhaps the element which more than any other defines the personality of this great English statesman: he lived his intense public life with a simple humility marked by good humor, even at the moment of his execution. His profound detachment from honors and wealth, his serene and joyful humility, his balanced knowledge of human nature and of the vanity of success, his certainty of judgment rooted in faith: these all gave him that confident inner strength that sustained him in adversity and in the face of death. His sanctity shone forth in his martyrdom, but it had been prepared by an entire life of work devoted to God and neighbor.

Fr. Barnaby Johns O.S.A.

A convert at sixteen, Fr. Barnaby Johns attended The Oratory, a school founded by St. John Henry Newman. As an Augustinian Friar, he was ordained to the priesthood by Bishop Robert Barron in October 2020 on the campus of Villanova Preparatory School in Ojai. Originally from Great Britain, Fr. Barnaby's extensive academic journey includes studies in Rome, London, St. Andrews, and San Francisco, where he earned master's degrees in both Biblical Studies and Catholic School Education. In the education field, he taught in the classroom and worked in administration for ten years before being elected as Prior Provincial of the Province of St. Augustine in California in 2024.

The Honorable Martin J. Jenkins

Justice Martin J. Jenkins was confirmed as an Associate Justice of the California Supreme Court on November 10, 2020, following his appointment by Governor Gavin Newsom. Previously, he served as Senior Judicial Appointments Advisor to Governor Newsom. Preceding his work for Governor Newsom, he served as an Associate Justice of the California Court of Appeal. Justice Jenkins' judicial experience includes service as a federal district judge for the Northern District of California; he was appointed by President William Clinton in May 1997 and confirmed by the United States Senate in November 1997. Earlier, he served as a trial judge on the Municipal and Superior Courts in Alameda County.

After graduating from Santa Clara University and before entering the University of San Francisco (USF) School of Law, Justice Jenkins was briefly employed as a player by the NFL's Seattle Seahawks. He obtained his law degree from USF in May 1980, when he received the Judge Harold J. Haley Award for "exceptional distinction in scholarship, character, and activities." After graduation, Justice Jenkins worked as a prosecutor for the Alameda County District Attorney's Office. He subsequently served as a trial attorney for the United States Department of Justice, Civil Rights Division-Criminal Section in Washington D.C., and later was an attorney in Pacific Bell's Legal Department where he handled a wide variety of litigation matters.

Justice Jenkins has been the recipient of numerous awards, including The St. Thomas More Award, presented annually by the St. Thomas More Society of San Francisco, "In Recognition of His Distinguished Record of Service and Dedication to His Church, His Community, and His Family," and the Children's Advocacy Award, presented by Legal Services for Children, San Francisco, for "Outstanding leadership in public policy that protects children and youth from abuse and exploitation." In 2018, the USF Board of Trustees conferred upon Justice Jenkins an honorary degree, "The Degree of Doctor of Humane Letters Honoris Causa." The American Inns of Courts named Justice Jenkins its 2022 recipient of the Lewis F. Powell Jr. Award for Professionalism and Ethics.

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ABOUT THE RED MASS

The Red Mass is traditionally held at the opening of the judicial year and is attended by judges, lawyers, public officials and law faculty. The Red Mass was first celebrated in Paris in 1245. From the time of Edward I, the Mass was offered in England at Westminster Abbey and received its name from the scarlet robes worn by the Lord High Justices. The first American Red Mass was held in New York City on October 6, 1928 at Old St. Andrew's Church. In Washington D.C., the Red Mass opens the new term of the U.S. Supreme Court at the Cathedral of Saint Matthew the Apostle.

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
